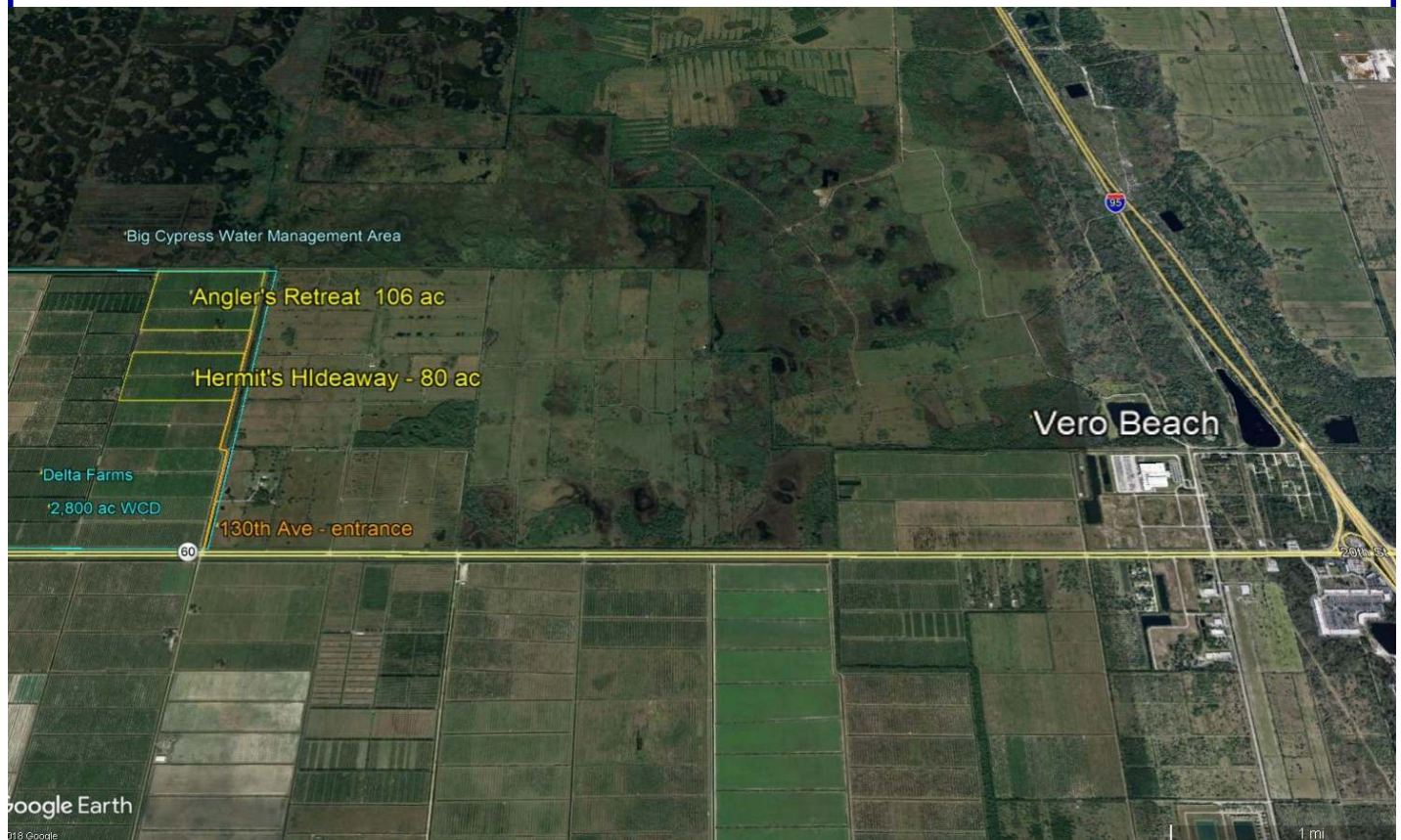

The Wetlands Reserve Program at 20 Years

The Wetlands Reserve Program (WRP) has helped private landowners voluntarily restore, protect and enhance wetlands and wildlife habitat on their lands since 1992. The cumulative benefits

of the wetlands restored through WRP reach well beyond their boundaries to improve watershed health, the vitality of agricultural lands, and aesthetics and economies of local communities.

Wetlands are among the most biologically productive ecosystems in the world, comparable to tropical rainforests and coral reefs in the diversity of species they support. While wetlands only occupy about five percent of the continental U.S. land surface, up to one-half of all North American bird species feed or nest in wetlands, more than one-third of Endangered and Threatened species rely on them, and wetlands are home to nearly one-third of our plant species.

- Provide habitat for migratory birds, fish and other wildlife
- Improve water quality and groundwater recharge
- Provide flood protection
- Offer farmers an alternative for frequently flooded cropland
- Provide education and recreational opportunities
- Sequester carbon to help reduce greenhouse gases
- Aid in the recovery and prevent listing of rare and declining species
- Protect cultural resources
- Promote open space, rural aesthetics and scenic vistas
- Help local economies

Over the last 20 years, WRP's voluntary, private lands approach has made it the Federal Government's premier wetland conservation program. Year after year, WRP has delivered benefits to both the individual participating and the American public from the services WRP wetlands provide.

WORKSHOP NOTICE
The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Office at 2720 AUSTIN BLVD will be notified during normal working hours seven days prior to construction and seven working days prior to the day for the following items or activities set to be performed:

- Start to large (2' deep)
- Completion of excavation (2' deep)
- Placement of riprap (2' deep)
- Vegetative measures (2' deep)
- Construction of equipment (2' deep)

Failure to notify the NRCS in that there is an opportunity to inspect the work may result in the Natural Resources Conservation Service not being able to verify that the job will meet standards and specifications.

GENERAL CONTRACTOR: It will be the responsibility of the contractor to obtain all necessary permits and approvals from all applicable agencies and to coordinate with the NRCS and the Indian River Soil and Water Conservation District for the construction of the project.
CONSTRUCTION RESPONSIBILITY: It will be the responsibility of the contractor to ensure that the project is constructed according to the attached drawings and specifications.
SCOPE OF CONSTRUCTION: NRCS will be installing a minimum of 7 days flow to construction.

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While Property is currently used as a citrus grove, it must be cleared and returned to natural status by 2021, and as such, the proposed earliest closing would be early 2021, once the earth-work is completed. Or there could be a license lease back agreement for the current owner to complete harvest and construction for the new Buyer.

When complete, the Property will be fully fenced and reseeded for grazing. After completion, owner can expect approximately 40% plus grazing capacity, fluctuating seasonally, per a Compatibility Use Agreement with NRCS.

Additionally, the design and location embedded just south of permanent water restoration STA features ensures final waterfowl habitat, fishing and recreational use..

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
